EU Studies Semester Abroad Program in Strasbourg, France

This is an affordable, comprehensive **16 week study abroad semester program** which offers students a unique opportunity to gain first hand knowledge of European policy and politics.



All courses are taught in English.

Students have a choice of **4 flexible enrollment options:**

1. Complete ALL of the courses taught by GSU instructors at the Château
2. Combine GSU and University of Strasbourg courses
3. Complete an internship and enroll in one or two courses
4. Complete just an internship

Multiple field trips, cultural excursions and professional visits are also an integral part of the program.

This semester program is open to undergraduate and graduate level university students from the University System of Georgia, other state institutions, as well as out of state schools.

Program Highlights

- French is not required. All courses are taught in English!
- Program is based in Strasbourg, France
- A "Survival French" course (20 hours) will help students get off the right foot
- Program includes housing, some meals, all transportation for planned visits, airport transfers, welcome and farewell dinners

Housing



Students will live and study in the Château de Pourtalès (pictured above), which is an 18th century French castle and only 3 miles from the city center. The castle provides classroom space, computer lab, library, student kitchen, dining rooms and dormitory rooms. Numerous outdoor and recreational facilities are located on the property and nearby. During excursions outside of Strasbourg, students will be housed in hotels.

Scholarships & Financial Aid
